#### From Our Chair - Liz Brunwin:

Since moving to Shimpling 5 years ago, I've been very impressed by the strong sense of community. I can't think of anyone who doesn't want to live in a village with a thriving community but when you are looking for a new home, it may not be the first thing on your mind.

Last year I was asked to take care of the Shimpling Archive; it was interesting to read how many community activities had taken place over the years from 50/50 auctions, whist drives, quiz nights, 8 day week (still not sure how this worked), fetes, coffee mornings etc. These events have raised significant amounts of money over the years but more importantly have brought the village together.

Recently it was heartening to hear how concerned villagers were for the more vulnerable members of our community when the buses to Bury were cut. As you will be aware, we with other local PC's, have managed to secure a bus on a Wednesday to Bury and this is being well supported although Suffolk County Council has made it clear that if this support doesn't continue, we may lose the service.

With budget cuts to local services, villages depend more and more on voluntary help to keep their villages tidy. You may

disagree with the politics of the cutbacks but at the end of the day, to make our villages decent places to live, we have to accept that these jobs need to be done.

The day after I moved to Shimpling, the Bush closed due to the untimely and tragic death of the landlady. I had been looking forward to having a pub within walking distance to where I lived in the village so this was a blow. It was a further year before Shimpling resident, Dawn Warner and her team, reopened the pub and she runs it very much with the local community in mind. We are so lucky to still have our pub (there were 2 in Alpheton that no longer exist). Certainly, estate agents and planning applications mention it as a facility in their selling pitches.

Our Village Hall Committee has worked tirelessly over the years producing pantomimes and social events that bring the village together. These are enjoyed by those who take part but none of this can happen without the villagers who organise them. They also do a fantastic job of maintaining the Village Hall. So many village halls are unused and unloved so if you feel that you could help them by becoming a committee member, we can then continue to run these types of events as well as introducing new ones.

I am always amazed by the numbers of people who offer help but I think it is important that we do our bit to support our community in order that it continues to thrive and stays the same special village that it is. I appreciate that our lives are very busy but if you feel that you can help in any way – volunteering and supporting village events, the village hall committee and the pub, it would be enormously appreciated.

#### YOUR VILLAGE NEEDS YOU!

#### What's been happening:

#### Recycling

Please remember that the parish council receives money from the paper and glass deposited in the recycling bins near the Bush PH. This income helps to run the council and therefore is a direct benefit to the village. Please keep recycling.

#### **Textile Recycling Bank**

Following on from our update in the last newsletter and positive feedback on the idea, the Parish Council (PC) will progress the initiative to try and secure a textile bank for the village to complement the bottle and paper banks.

#### **Annual Village Spring Clean**

A date has been set for the annual Village Clean Up morning of Sunday 15th March at 11.00am. This is a chance to clear the village of litter and to clean road signs. This year she

would also like to add the cleaning of the village bus stop and will advertise and ask for volunteers to help with this.

#### **Public Transport**

Following on from all the hard work done by ClIr Shrimpton and other local Parish Councils, the Chair was pleased to report that Suffolk County Council have agreed a weekly bus on a Wednesday to Bury St Edmunds. This service is subject to regular reviews so if it is not adequately supported, it will be withdrawn. This has been publicised in the local press and leaflets have been posted on noticeboards, through letter boxes, via the village round robin and on the Shimpling Community Facebook page. The Parish Council continue to press for public access to the school bus each morning

Delighted villagers welcome the return of bus route 375 to

Bury St Edmunds

Villagers gathered at the bus shelter in Shimpling village early

on the this morning as they enthusiastically awaited the return of route 375 bus service between Sudbury and Bury St Edumunds.

The bus service, which was axed last November, was reinstated on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2020 following a campaign led by villagers and Parish Councillors for the provision of a much-needed bus route which helps to combat social isolation.

Working with Suffolk County Council, Chambers Bus has taken over the route and the morning service will arrive in Bury at 10.22am, with a return bus at 1.15pm.

Speaking at the bus shelter, resident Sylvia Small said, "I am so happy the service has come back. I don't get out a lot and don't drive, so without a bus service I would be stuck at home. I am heading into Bury St Edmunds today as I finally have a chance to get to a shop and recycle my batteries."

The weekly service, which runs every Wednesday between Bury St Edmunds and Sudbury serves the villages of Alpheton, Shimpling, Cockfield, Lawshall, Hawsted, Nowton.

"It's so convenient travelling into Bury St Edmunds by bus, it takes you on a picturesque route right into the heart of the town and back again, no hassle, no fuss. We love to visit for a coffee, a bit of shopping and even to browse the library but also in the summer, we can enjoy a few hours at the wonderful park the town has to offer," **commented David and Madeline Gray.** 

Mrs Gray is also a Parish Councillor for Alpheton Council.

Also, on board was college student George Cooper who remarked, "Travelling by bus allows me to better manage my own time without having to rely on family to take me to and from college. I currently catch the Chambers 751 and now the 375 into Bury St Edmunds, but the new service allows me a bit more time in the morning which means I even get a lie in!"

In a growing society, where social isolation is becoming even more apparent and may impact on people's mental health and wellbeing, local resident Colin Johnston commented, "Our bus service is very important, especially for residents who are unable to walk far or don't have access to a car. The bus service not only gives these people a reason to get out and about but also an opportunity to chat with others as they travel together."

John West from Hawsted Council and Gerry Shrimpton from Shimpling Village both thanked Chambers Bus for bringing the service back.

"We are delighted that Chambers has reinstated route 375 back to our villages and we hope that our villagers continue to support the bus service, so it remains viable route," said John West.

With many children growing up in these villages, the demand for access to these large towns will continually increase. Helen Pilgrim, a mum of teenagers stated that "It will be great for our children to have access to the bus service, at least once a week in the school holidays, allowing them time to go shopping and meet up with friends."

"It was wonderful to see so many happy passengers getting on board today" said Elizabeth Roberts, Operations Manager for Chambers Bus. "We have worked very closely with local councillors and Suffolk County Council to develop a solution for all since it was cut last November. We will continue to review its demand over time and hope that the service continues to receive the level of support which has been shown today."

Villagers can travel from Shimpling to Bury St Edmunds on route 375 for £3.50 return, with cheaper fares at each village on route. Bus passes can be used.

#### Assets of Community Value

Following a suggestion from a villager, the PC are considering applying for the Bush Inn Public House to be registered as an Asset of Community Value. This was discussed at the last PC meeting and the PC agreed to move forward by writing to the owner.

It is important to point out that, while the PC does not need the consent of the owner to progress this, all it does is register and interest for the village in the pub in case it ever came up for sale. The PC considers the pub to be a vital community asset and encourages all villagers to use it as often as possible to ensure it continues to be a worthwhile business.

He wouldn't settle for the affordable basic wooden window frames, and insisted on paying for durable low-maintenance UPVC frames. Twenty four years later – how grateful we are to Eddie.

They were keen to see the hall in regular use and for many years ran monthly whist drives which were very popular. As well as the Village Hall, they regularly attended Parish Council Meetings, supported church events and were genuinely interested in the welfare of their neighbours – particularly young families.



#### **Ten Plimsoll Lines**

During Victorian times many lives were lost at sea. Too often this was not due to the unpredictability of the weather, but on ships being overloaded by their greedy owners. Aggrieved by the loss of life on these 'coffin ships', an MP called Samuel Plimsoll campaigned for a line to be drawn around every hull signifying the maximum load. His 'Unseaworthy Ships Bill' was passed by Parliament in 1876. To this day across the world, the 'Plimsoll line' continues to serve as a clear line which must not be passed in order to preserve life, and indeed to obey the law.

I recently read about a church minister who compared the Plimsoll line to each of the Ten Commandments, reminding us that these were also lines which, for the sake of those around us, should not be crossed. Reflecting on a lifetime of teaching, he lamented that these clear warnings are no longer taken seriously: "Within living memory ... the Ten Commandments ... were honoured publicly as rules for life and to break them publicly was something done with at least embarrassment and possibly shame. Then, with time, they became downgraded to being merely 'guidelines' or 'advice'; things that could be politely respected but then ignored. Now, if they are known at all, the Ten Commandments are openly treated with scorn or amusement. To take the plainest of the Commandments, we now find that such things as lying, adultery, hatred and greed are considered part of any normal human life."

The fact is that the Ten Commandments have not lost their relevance. How many situations of pain are you aware of this week which have been caused by the breaking one of the commandments? More uncomfortably, how many times are we aware that we have broken the commandments ourselves, finding ourselves in deep water and in need of forgiveness – something which thankfully Jesus offers?

The Commandments were cast in stone, so however the waves of an ever-changing culture break against them, their judgement still stands. Perhaps it is time for our culture to take them
