Report from our Chair, Liz Brunwin, at the meeting held on the 12th July:

It's been relatively quiet since our last meeting.

I attended a short webinar course on managing good performance which was although fairly basic, was useful.

I also attended Village Hall Committee AGM via Zoom and I can report that Nathalie Brown has agreed to replace Colin Johnston who was one of the PC representatives on the

committee following his move from the village.

Nathalie and I also met regarding the wildflower planting initiative and she has kindly agreed to take this forward. Work has now started on the land next to the village green. I received correspondence from a representative of one of our residents concerned that the developers were in breach of their planning conditions. This was reported to Babergh Planning Enforcement who admit that there are some breaches but it seems little that they will do about it. I feel frustrated that we continually have to chase both the district and County Councils (most recently for a response regarding the recycling bank lay-by and planning enforcement) and I thank our District and County Councillors for helping us to get responses for us.

Footpath No 7 has now been refurbished and has been reopened. My thanks go to Colin Johnson and Gerry Shrimpton for their hard work on this. I have received many positive comments from the local community so I think this project has been very much appreciated and was a job well done. I would also like to extend our thanks to Saffron West who very kindly agreed to allow the contractors to access the footpath from her land in order to get the job done. As some of you may be aware, Saffron's father, Nigel, died suddenly last year and later in the meeting I will be putting forward a suggestion to name the footpath after him.

Thanks also go to Colin Johnson for his hard work on gaining Quiet Lanes status for Gents Lane. This has now been approved and is awaiting signage.

Our thanks also go to Laurence Rooke for their help in fixing the door frame of the telephone box and for repointing the village sign.

Finally, it is my sad duty to report that, following his move to Northern Ireland, Colin Johnson will be leaving Shimpling Parish Council. I know that I speak for all those on the Parish Council when I thank him for all his hard work and commitment to our local community during his time with us. Colin has a wealth of expertise in planning and I know that we have all learnt so much from him which will help us with future planning applications. It's important to mention at this point that despite requests, Babergh offer little help training councillors on planning matters so we are all novices in this very complicated area of expertise. We now have a vacancy on the Parish Council and would welcome applications from anyone living in the village who could bring expertise in this or any other area which will help the village.

Recycling

Please remember that the Parish Council receives money from the glass, clothing and shoes deposited in the recycling bins near the Bush Inn. Clothing and shoes should be bagged before depositing in the clothing/shoe bank. This income helps to run the council and therefore is a direct benefit to the village. Babergh have delivered a 1100 litre blue metal recycling bin with specialist lid to be used instead of the metal paper bank. This will be emptied once a fortnight by our waste and recycling collection crews. This will be labelled up to advise users that this is only for paper and card .

Please keep recycling.

What the Parish Council have been up to ...

Over the last couple of months we have:

- Organised the resurfacing of Footpath 7, which runs from The Street round to Gents Lane, which we hope you will all agree is a lovely upgrade and makes for much safer walking conditions.
- Gents Lane has been approved as a Quiet Lane and we are awaiting the sign to go up to spread awareness of this new status.
- With the kind help of Ben Hutchinson, a step has been added to the Footpath opposite The Bush.
- Considering funding an upgrade to the recycling area, to make this look nicer when driving into the Village.

SARS UPDATE

THE IMPACT OF YOUR SUPPORT 2020-21

SARS receives no central government or NHS funding and we rely on voluntary grants and donations to maintain and expand our clinical resources. SARS clinical volunteers have been operational in Suffolk since 1972 and your support ensures that they can continue to have a positive impact on time-critical patients within the local community. Our clinicians are some of the most experienced pre-hospital clinicians in the region and include Consultants in Emergency Medicine, Consultant Anaesthetists, Critical Care Paramedics and Advanced Clinical Practitioners. This skill-base means that they can utilise specialist equipment and drugs which are not normally found on frontline ambulances. A SARS team or solo responder can therefore often undertake complex procedures which would not normally be possible outside the hospital environment. These can be truly lifesaving interventions as well as reducing the chances of patients suffering permanent disability and providing fast relief from pain.

Over the last financial year (April 2020 – March 2021) SARS volunteer responders were mobilised 356 times. This represents nearly a call a day despite the challenges of the ongoing pandemic. Calls attended included serious road traffic collisions, cardiac arrests, serious falls, equestrian and sporting incidents, psychiatric episodes and stabbings. Interventions undertaken by SARS responders included anaesthesia, sedations, surgical procedures, and advanced airway management. The most critical patients were often accompanied by a SARS clinician to hospital to ensure their condition remained stable throughout.

A huge thank you to everybody who supported our Plant Sale in June, with donations, coming to buy, and grappling with the



marquee, etc.! Financially, it was our most successful ever, which will be a big help in bringing some good speakers to the meetings, but as important I think, was the chance to see so many of our members and friends, some for the first time in fifteen months. Everybody had a smile on their face! The Church did a fantastic job with some lovely refreshments, and I understand made a nice amount of money too. Good news all round.

This was followed by a visit to a beautiful garden the next evening, Cattishall Farmhouse, in Great Barton. It opens for the National Garden Scheme, and is highly recommended for their openings next year. The owner also bakes some excellent cakes! In July we went on our second visit of the year, to West Lodge, at Bradfield St. George. It was a lovely garden, lots of different areas, giving something for everyone. And timed perfectly - it started to spit with rain just as we were leaving. On August 2nd, we had our first meeting in the Institute Hall since March 2020! It was so good to be back, and the speaker was one of our favourites, Nigel Start, on the subject "Self Sufficiency from your Garden". His talk was as entertaining as always - and informative, beginning with the history of food growing, then onto the how, what, when and where of growing both vegetables and fruit, including the tricky subjects of hot and cold composting!

In September we have a couple of events. The meeting on Monday 6th will be all about wasps! Dr. Ian Bedford will come and tell us why we need them. I look forward to being convinced. We start at 7.30pm, in the Institute Hall at Hartest. Visitors are always welcome to come along to our

meetings, with no pressure to join. Entry is £2 for members, £3 for visitors, which includes refreshments.

Then on the following Friday and Saturday, our Annual Show will take place in the Institute hall. Anybody is welcome to enter, the list of classes is available on the Show page of our website – www.hartestgardeningclub.info – along with a sheet of handy hints and the timetable and rules.

Entries can be brought along between 6pm and 7pm on Friday 10th, or on Saturday 11th between 9.30am and 11am, 25p per entry. Judging is from 11.15am, then we open up again at 2.30pm for the prize giving and a raffle.

If you haven't shown before, it is great fun, and there will be stewards around to help you. There are classes for vegetables, fruit, flowers, floral arrangements, handicraft, preserves and baking - all skills we have had time to experiment with over lockdown! Come along and give it a go! Our October meeting is on Monday 4th, and is titled "Climate" Change - The Long Range Gardeners Forecast". This is a huge subject to cover in an hour, but will cover how, as gardeners, we can respond to changes, particularly in East Anglia. Will we get higher yields, or lose it all to pests and diseases?
