The Chair reported;

On behalf of everyone in Shimpling, I would like to thank the Village Hall Committee for a wonderful Jubilee weekend.

There were a huge range of events laid on to suit all ages. It was lovely to come together again and celebrate as a community. An awful lot of planning and hard work went in to creating a memorable weekend of celebration.

The final stages of works have been taking place to connect WiFi in the village hall. It has been a long process, so it's great that we are approaching the home straight. The hire of the hall will be available with full WiFi access in the next few weeks. We hope that this will be an attractive option for people wishing to hire the facilities and will enable the PC to move towards paperless meetings.

We have taken delivery of a beautiful wooden bench, which will be placed and secured near to the village sign shortly.

Recycling

Please remember that the Parish Council receives money from the paper (although not cardboard) glass, clothing and shoes deposited in the recycling bins near the Bush Inn.

Clothing and shoes should be bagged before depositing in the clothing/shoe bank. This income helps to run the council and therefore is a direct benefit to the village. **Please keep recycling.**

Over the last couple of months, we have:

- Chased the signage for the Quiet Lanes status for Gents Lane.

- Finally managed to get a WIFI connection into the Village Hall!

- Agreed tree planting for the Queens Platinum Jubilee.

Given funds to the Village Hall Committee for the Queens Platinum Jubilee celebrations and also to Alpheton and Shimpling PCC for the Chadacre Fete.

Received the bench for the Village Green and are just awaiting this to be placed.

I went to a talk the other day by someone reflecting on their experiences of retiring. There were two things in particular that struck me. SHIMPLING AND ALPHETON WI

Visit to Bulmer Brick and Tile Company



Tuesday 9th August and a radiantly sunny and warm day saw a number of Shimpling and Alpheton WI members make the short journey to Bulmer to have a guided visit around the Bulmer Brick and Tile Company, a place which was all but unknown to even some of the people born and bred in this area.

What a hidden gem! It was wonderful to see such artisan skills and passion for the craft in a humble village so close to home.

Peter Minter, the son of the man who purchased the company in 1932 showed us around together with his grandson Bart, one of the new generation of his family who were taking on the family mantle. It was good to observe the relationship between the two men; the older man proud of his grandson and the grandson holding his grandfather in very high esteem and respect. At the age of 89, the older gentleman is still working; though perhaps a little less strenuously than before, nevertheless still very much involved and hands on, not even taking the time to have a holiday.

The company make the creme de la creme of bespoke bricks for some of this country's most prestigious clients including the National Trust, English Heritage, Hampton Court Palace, Kensington Palace, St Pancras Station restoration, Claridges hotel, a large new development in the King's Road, London and nearer to home, Toppesfield Bridge to name but a few. This is the last remaining place that London clay is actually mined for use and it has been mined here since Tudor times, with the factory having been in the ownership of less than a handful of families in all that time.

As women watching, we were astonished at how the process of making bricks by hand appears almost to be like a clay equivalent of making a loaf!

When fired for a week in huge kilns, the clay shrinks by 12% so the moulds for whatever is being made has to be oversized by that much for a perfect final size. Earlier bricks were smaller and thinner than 19th century ones.

Given the intensive craftsmanship and skill involved in hand making each and every brick I was amazed to learn that a beautiful terracotta brick wall tile with a Tudor rose image in relief on it would only cost around £15.

Next time you are wandering around London, look around you and you may be seeing something of beauty from the Suffolk/Essex border.....

HARTEST AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

We have had a couple of garden visits since the last magazine, both gardens were beautiful. The first was Smallwood Farmhouse at Bradfield St. George, and the second was River Cottage at Lavenham. Very different, and well worth going to if you see them advertised as open.



We then returned to the Institute for our August meeting, and a fascinating talk by Dr Gwenda Kyd on plants used in medicine, whether traditional, complementary or commercial. I think we all learnt something at this one.

The next talk, on Monday September 5th, will be on the speaker's choice of the best plants for autumn. Colin Ward, with his wife, owns and runs Swines Meadow Farm Nursery, specialising in plants from all around the world. They have won many medals at prestigious flower shows. He will talk about his particular favourite plants for this time of year, and there should be examples for sale!

Later that week is our Annual Show, the highlight of our year! The list of classes, along with some helpful hints on exhibiting, is available on our website Show page, and can also be picked up at the meeting above. There really is a class for everyone, even with the growing conditions this year! If you haven't any vegetables, how about fruit? Or a pot plant? A pot of jam? Even some flapjacks or a knitted hat. Entries can be brought along to the Institute between 6pm and 7pm on Friday September 9th, or between 9.30am and 11am on Saturday 10th. Each entry will cost you 25p, and anybody can enter, you don't have to be a member of the club,

We then close, and get all the judging done, before opening up again at 2.30pm. The silverware will be handed out at 3pm,

and a raffle drawn at 3.30pm. We would love to see lots of people come along - the school exhibits will be in their usual pride of place.

The October talk, on Monday 3rd, will be another attractive one, especially for those who are interested in agricultural or social history. Ruth Goudy will be speaking about her family, beginning with her grandfather, who grew up in poverty. One of nine children, he left school at 14 and had to make his own way in the world. This is the story of how he created a fruit farm in Suffolk, how his son had to convert to arable farming to meet the demands of the times and how Ruth and her husband have diversified and built a plant nursery over the last 20 years. There are many changes and cycles to be seen along the way. The talk will bring back memories for those who grew up during this period of massive rural change.

And in November the subject is perhaps more traditional, "A Very British Garden". Darren Lerigo will talk about the flowers and shrubs we find in the typical British Garden and offers alternatives to the 'normal' plants we pop into our perennial borders. He suggests easier ways to deal with slugs, simple compost making and the benefits of fungi for growing your own vegetables.

Not so much an historical look at our gardens but very much a modern look at how gardens can work for us right now. This talk should provide food for thought! This meeting is on Monday 7th, and will include our AGM, when annual subscriptions of £12.50 will be collected.

The meetings start at 7.30pm. The entry fee for September and October is £2 for members, £3 for visitors, which will include light refreshments. There will be no entry fee for the November meeting, but as with the other meetings, we will have a raffle! We are a friendly group, please come along and see for yourself!
