Could you volunteer to help your Village?

We need a new Parish Councillor to join our team. Parish Councillors do a worthwhile job ensuring that your voice is heard and overseeing work so that your village is kept looking good. If you would like to know more about becoming a Councillor then please get in touch with the Clerk or any of our wonderful Councillors.

Report from Chair, David Dunkley:

The Chair reported in the July meeting; It has been a relatively quiet time since May. We are approaching the final stages of the project to introduce EV Car Chargers at the Village Hall with all documentation very close to agreement. At this stage, the actual installation of the chargers has yet to be discussed.

The Neighbourhood Plan has been progressing well with a draft version of the plan about to be pulled together for discussion amongst the project group. However, the government has decided to cease funding the development of Neighbourhood Plans, although, apparently, still approving their creation, so we are discussing with our consultant on what is still left to do. Obviously, the Parish Council will now have to determine the best way forward.

The new bus service was finally announced. This will provide a 6-days a week service for the village, with bus times to be announced soon. I would like to thank Councillor Shrimpton for his considerable efforts, and patience, and also all of those connected with bus services at Suffolk CC for their support in providing the service.

On a broader note, Local Government Reorganisation and Devolution for Suffolk and East Anglia is ongoing, and at quite a fast pace as our area is designated as an early adopter. This is supposed to come with additional funding, but the level of that and where it will be allocated has not, as yet, been confirmed.

Devolved government, through the election of a Mayor, is different from Local Government Reorganisation, albeit collaboration will be necessary. Some dates to be aware of are:

- Election of Mayor. May 26
- Shadow election of councillors to new authorities May

- Implementation of new authorities Apr 28
- It is unclear when elections to existing authorities will occur.

The Mayor will take over the responsibilities of the Police & Crime Commissioner, but PCC stays in place until 2028 when their term concludes.

Hopefully more clarity will show itself as time goes by.

Recycling

Please remember that the Parish Council receives money from the paper (although not cardboard) glass, clothing and shoes deposited in the recycling bins near the Bush Inn. Clothing and shoes should be bagged before depositing in the clothing/shoe bank. This income helps to run the council and therefore is a direct benefit to the village. Please keep recycling.

There have been issues raised regarding speeding in the Village, this has been raised both to the PC and it was commented on frequently in the Neighbourhood Plan Surveys. The PC are looking at possibly setting up a community speed watch. However, we will need volunteers! To set up a scheme

Each scheme must have a co-ordinator (who will be the point of contact for the team) and where possible a deputy

The Parish (or local) Council support the scheme You will have to sign a CSW agreement and be vetted

Training will be provided on using the equipment and on Health

Shimpling Parish Neighbourhood Plan

Following on from the last update in the Spring Newsletter; progress on the Neighbourhood Plan has been somewhat slow over the last few months.


We are pleased to report that the Landscape Assessment Report is completed; which will be an appendix to the Neighbourhood Plan; along with the Design Guide. This will be uploaded to the village website shortly: https://shimpling-pc.gov.uk/neighbourhood-plan-2/


The Committee also met with the Consultant in early May to discuss what planning policies should be included in the Neighbourhood Plan and the Committee have just received the draft Neighbourhood Plan. The Committee are due to meet on the 5th September to review and feedback comments to the Consultant for further amendments; before it is submitted to the District Council, then for Independent Examination, before the final Parish Referendum.

However, in mid-June we were informed that the Government will not be funding the Neighbourhood Plan Support Programme for 2025/26 as a result of their Spending Review.

We are waiting for confirmation from the Consultant as to what has been already been paid for and therefore what is left that will no longer be covered by the Government funding. We believe we are three quarters of the way through and will therefore need to find funding for the final quarter. Once we have the full picture we can start to look into funding options but believe that it is important for the Neighbourhood Plan to be completed; especially as we have got this far!; and can confirm that this is the view of the Parish Council and Babergh District Council as well. We will keep you posted....

Reflection - Just 10

(this is an article I first wrote for the Melford Village Magazine a few weeks ago, however in Shimpling you may identify who I am talking about ...!)

I was put in my place earlier this week. On a day when I had completed my tax return and battled with Church of England bureaucracy, I popped into The Bush in Shimpling for some late evening relief after a meeting. I confess to having a bit of rant about all the rules and regulations in modern life. However, the lady behind the bar asked me what my problem was because "I only had ten!".

It actually took me a second or two to see the twinkle in her eye, and to realise that she was talking about the Ten Commandments! Perhaps we all need reminding so here's a summary of them: worship God not idols, don't misuse God's name, have a day of rest, honour your parents, don't kill, don't commit adultery, don't steal, don't lie, don't lust, and don't be envious. Reading through the list I wonder which ones stand out for you?

Laws are intended to protect the vulnerable, and to encourage loving behaviour and social cohesion; furthermore, they should be applied consistently. Much as laws are important, one does sometimes wonder whether our society is becoming so overwhelmed with rules and regulations that, rather than enabling life to flourish, they risk becoming a miserable burden or even a tool of control.

Jesus summarised the commandments using just two - love God and love your neighbour. To do this we do need still to treat the laws of our land with respect wherever possible. Accordingly, I had a coffee (not excessive alcohol!), and after enjoying some conversation drove home below the speed limit. Given all that is going on in the world at the moment maybe I should not let



myself get so wound up.



HARTEST AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

We have had a busy few months throughout June and July, with some amazing visits to four local gardens, each enjoyed in glorious sunshine.



Church Cottage, Troston packs a lot into its ¾ of an acre, showcasing a yew allée, mixed borders (including grasses, roses and perennials), an informal pond and a 'New Wave Perennial' open border, a small area of woodland plants, trees and shrubs, a gravel garden and a productive kitchen garden with raised beds (including one for alpine plants) and not one, but two greenhouses!

Brook Farm, which has been lovingly created over the last five years by Mary Giblin, a former GP at Glemsford Surgery. Largely created during the COVID lockdown, alongside her octogenarian mother, Mary reshaped the existing herbaceous borders and removed laurels, briar roses, matted grass, ground elder, brambles and nondescript trees. Numerous flowering shrubs have since been added alongside cottage garden perennials, a new kitchen garden, greenhouse and cutting garden. In total, the garden covers 9.5 acres with a 4.5 acre woodland and lake.

This was followed by a visit to the **beautiful garden of a Gardening Club member** who has found great solace and a new-found interest in the garden that his late wife loved so much. The tour was called 'Life without the Lady Gardener' with all donations in aid of Marie Curie, a cancer charity that gave practical help during a very difficult time.

Denston Hall is home to James and Selina Hopkins. Selina is garden designer Xa Tollemache's daughter and grew up at Helmingham Hall. Originally designed by Mark Rumary,

Denston Hall gardens have subsequently been influenced and adjusted by Xa Tollemache. As well as a fruit, vegetable and cutting garden there are borders containing step-over apples, with the walls providing sheltered space for vines and figs. Other features included shrub borders, a nut walk and a quincunx of medlar trees.
