Join us!

We need 2 new Parish Councillors to join our team. Parish Councillors do a worthwhile job ensuring that your voice is heard and overseeing work so that your village is kept looking good. If you would like to know more about becoming a Councillor then please get in touch with the Clerk or any of our wonderful Councillors.

Report from our Chair, Liz Brunwin, at the meeting held on the 10th January:

The Chairman reported that it had been quiet since the last meeting in November. She had received thanks from several villagers for the donation from the Parish Council of the village Christmas tree. She extended thanks to Laurence Rooke, Ted Pine and Karenza and Mark Jackson for their help in putting up the tree, supplying the electricity and removing it in early January. Christmas in the village had felt more normal this year with events taking place at the Village Hall (thanks to the church and Village

Hall Committee) although the East of England was currently experiencing a surge in Covid infections.

The Chairman reported that we were waiting for the Quiet Lanes Sign to be erected and that unfortunately, the sign could not be fixed it to the current telegraph pole.

The Parish Council are still looking to improve the layby next to the recycling banks and hope to have an update on this at the next meeting in March.

BT had informed us in December that they had done the necessary groundwork for the installation of WIFI and are expected to connect to the Village Hall sometime in January.

The Village Hall Committee are busy working on the events to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in June. The Parish Council have agreed to plant a tree as part of the Queen's request to 'plant a tree for the Jubilee.'

Several people in the village have expressed interest in the Parish Councillor vacancies, and it is hoped that we will have the vacancies filled very soon. Unfortunately, no one had come forward to take on the role of Chairman when the Chairman steps down in May and the Chairman urged councillors to reconsider as Babergh have informed us that if we cannot vote in a new Chairman in May, this will cause issues in running the budget.

Recycling

Please remember that the Parish Council receives money from the paper (although not cardboard) glass, clothing and shoes deposited in the recycling bins near the Bush Inn. Clothing and shoes should be bagged before depositing in the clothing/shoe bank. This income helps to run the council and therefore is a direct benefit to the village. Please keep recycling.

What the Parish Council have been up to ...

Over the last couple of months, we have:

- Gents Lane has been approved as a Quiet Lane and we are awaiting the sign to go up to spread awareness of this new status.
- Approved funding to improve the surface of the layby by the recycling area.
- The PC have agreed to pay £3,188 from the Covid Fund to have WIFI installed into the Village Hall. We hope you will all agree that this will be a good addition to the Village and could mean new revenue for the Village Hall.
- Discussed possible tree planting for the Queens Platinum Jubilee, members would like to plant a Norwegian Spruce tree on the Village Green.
- The PC are looking at the possibility of getting two benches for the Village Green.
- Organised a date for the annual Village litter pick (Sunday 13th March)

An even greater test?

Ukraine could well be the most significant.

Despite the many divisions we experienced during Brexit, and some very ugly stereotyping, the majority of people, to their credit, have managed to get along with those holding very different views about the role of the UK and Europe.

Despite the tragedy, isolation, frustration and emotional exhaustion as a result of the pandemic, we seem to be emerging at last thanks to the heroic efforts of many, and it is hard to deny that there have been some blessings.

Brexit ... Covid ... and now war in Ukraine, but the war in

But the situation in Ukraine may demand more. We will again be forced to think about what really matters in life ... and what is superficial dross (of which there is much). Sadly evil is a reality in this life, and confrontation is sometimes unavoidable. Let us pray that at a personal level and as a nation we can have the strength of character to protect the vulnerable from oppression, and to seek the peace of all who are caught up in this horrible conflict.

Triggers - 'my truth' about them

The term 'trigger' has new-found prominence in our lexicon. It is not the thing that fires a gun. A trigger is something you do or say which causes a negative, involuntary reaction to the listener. For example, the word 'semolina' triggers a retching feeling in me! However more commonly the term is used for more emotive areas such as faith, class, gender, and race. In some ways it is a helpful term; it can remind us to us be aware how others will react to us, and make us think about our own prejudices if someone 'triggers' us.

But it is also a term which can encourage self-centred

thinking. It can be divisive, and a lazy excuse to lessen the humanity of the person we react to. In extreme cases it can pronounce a guilty verdict when no sin has been committed. The path to God requires us to humbly accept that none of us are perfect, to try to see God's likeness in all people, and to be open to the path of forgiveness. In fact, God often uses people we find difficult to test our character ... and to teach us about how to trigger love.

HARTEST AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

A good turnout at our meeting in February, after the January one had to be cancelled due to the speaker not being able to



make it. The Secretary apologised that an item had been missed at the AGM. The Committee had recommended that with effect from November 2022, the Annual Subscription for membership be increased from £10 to £12.50, and that the meeting entry be increased from £2 to £2.50 for members and from £3 to £5 for visitors. A vote was taken, and this was agreed by those present. She also told the meeting that the Committee had decided not to renew the RHS Affiliated Societies membership. It would have cost £36, not a huge amount, but it adds up over the years, and the only real benefit is the chance of a free group visit. As quite a few of us are already RHS members, we would be able to get quite a good sized group in anyway. The Secretary will continue to bring "The Garden" magazine to the meetings. The money saved will be going towards replacing the rather aged banners for the Plant Sale and the Annual Show.

It was lovely to have Annie Robinson resuming her 'Plant of the Month' slot, bringing along a Cyclamen Coum to talk about, beautifully presented as a kokedama – wrapped in moss – which she kindly donated to the raffle.

Helen Chen then gave us a very interesting talk about "Asian Woodland Plants for UK Gardens", travelling through plants for dry and damp shade from China and Japan. It has been estimated that two-thirds of the plants in English gardens have Chinese origins, so it is obvious what a huge effect the

discoveries in that area have had. She is a very good speaker, with a huge knowledge of her subject, and accompanied the talk with some excellent, very clear photos. She does other talks, so we may well see her again.

The next meeting is on March 7th, and sees the return of Dr. Twigs Way, a very entertaining speaker, fresh from her exceptional internet series for the Garden Trust on Forgotten Women Gardeners. This time she is telling us all about "Traditional Wildflower Names", from Cow Mumble and Pilewort to Priests Pintles and Pigs Pettitoes, the origins are fascinating. Twigs is a very experienced speaker who has delighted us with her talks on previous occasions. She is always entertaining and enlightening on any given subject. Not to be missed.

April's meeting is on Monday 4th, with Andrew Babicz coming to talk on "Seasonal Container Gardening". Over 50 years in horticulture Andrew has worked for organisations such as The National Trust Scotland, RHS Wisley, Kew and Hampton Court. He has been a contributor to magazines such as The English Garden and 'Metro' and is the secretary and judge for The London Gardens Society. With such a raft of experience this should be a very informative and interesting talk giving us ideas for containers not just with summer planting but for all year round interest.

In May we have a couple of events, firstly our meeting on Monday 9th should see Sally Hepher finally getting to talk to us. She was first booked in for 2020, then for 2021, so it will be good to find out what "Wish I'd Known When I Started Out" is all about! Sally is a lifelong keen gardener. She joined the RHS in 1986 and has been to every Chelsea

Flower Show since. She is now on her third garden which she designed herself from scratch on part of an old apple farm. She did a horticulture degree at Writtle College after working in the city. She then worked for a decade, part-time, at 'The Place for Plants'. Sally will be talking about practical gardening covering some elements of garden layout, soil, compost, mulch, tools, safety, horror plants, weeds, etc. This will be an amusing as well as informative look at the trials and tribulations of being a gardener.

On Sunday May 15th we will have our Plant Sale, hopefully on the Green, as we did so successfully last year, but in the Institute Hall weather is not on our side. Refreshments will be available, in aid of the Church, and there will also be a Tombola stall. Donations of plants from 12 noon, with the sale starting at 2pm.



Meetings start at 7.30pm in the Institute Hall at Hartest, entry £2 for members, £3 for visitors. Please feel free to come along if you haven't been before, it is always lovely to get a good sized audience for our speakers. There is no pressure to join the club.




