

# Report from our Chair, Liz Brunwin, at the meeting held on the 26<sup>th</sup> April:

The Chair extended her apologies for the long agenda. Unfortunately the scheduled meeting in May had had to be included because the Government are being challenged in the Courts about the ending of virtual meetings from the 6<sup>th</sup> May and the resumption of face to face meetings.

The Chair was happy to report that all the actions from the

last playground inspection have been dealt with thanks in no small part to Shimpling resident, Ben Hutchinson, who very kindly dealt with issues flagged up in the last inspection on a materials only basis.

Following a suggestion from a resident to move the recycling banks to the area outside the Village Hall, the Chair had met with a representative of Babergh. However, he has reported that the contractors would have difficulties turning into the access road to collect and delivery recycling banks, so this was not an option. The Chair had also contacted Suffolk Highways regarding the proposed improvements to the layby by the recycling banks on several occasions but has not as yet received a response.

The Chair had chased Suffolk Highways about the reported overhanging trees in The Street which were the subject of a discussion at the last Parish Council meeting. Suffolk Highways sent out a representative out to inspect the area but their report (which stated nothing needed to be done) clearly showed that they were looking in the wrong place. In the event, local residents took the matter into their own hands and cut the offending trees down themselves in order to avoid any damage to vehicles. The Chair thanked all those involved for their efforts. She reported that she had written to Suffolk Highways suggesting that it might be prudent in future for representatives to meet with a member of the council on-site so to avoid any confusion in future.

The Chair was also pleased to reported the good news that The Bush had been purchased by a villager and is to be reopened.

#### Recycling

Please remember that the parish council receives money from the glass, clothing and shoes deposited in the recycling bins near the Bush Inn. Clothing and shoes should be bagged before depositing in the clothing/shoe bank. This income helps to run the council and therefore is a direct benefit to the village. Please keep recycling.

#### What the Parish Council have been up to ...

Over the last couple of months we have:

Organised the remedial works on the playground to be carried out. Our thanks go to Ben Hutchinson for doing this work at materials only cost.

Arranged for the ariel runway chain to be inspected in the playground.

We are working through the processes with nominating Gents Lane as a Quiet Lane.

The Parish Council are starting a project on Footpath No7, which runs from The Street round to Gents Lane This is a large scale project that will hopefully start in May to improve the footpath surface and make it safer for walking.

With the kind help of volunteers – Laurence Rooke and Ted Pine, the village sign has been repointed and the door of the telephone box repaired.

# Well done ... a bit of reflection ... and Lawshall Well done!

We are thankful that lockdown continues to lift, and as it does we have an opportunity to refle

we have an opportunity to reflect on all that has happened during the pandemic. One of the many things which stands out for me is



the extraordinary response of our villages when lockdown first struck. Shimpling was a great example. Almost immediately there was a regular news-sheet providing helpful information and offering support to those in need. People helped each other with various practical tasks. Food (and even flour!) was made available. I certainly consider myself very fortunate to serve in a community which put into practice 'love thy neighbour'.

#### A bit of reflection ...

It has been an interesting year for me as a minister. Clearly our thoughts and prayers must firstly go to those who were directly affected by the virus, and also others affected by illness (including mental illness).

But even though our churches were locked for a time, I believe it has been a significant year spiritually. We have been thinking hard about what is important in life ... about the environment, about the importance of family and community, about the limitations of human wisdom, and indeed about our mortality. I think many people are feeling closer to God. We have been livestreaming Sunday services every week since lockdown started at 10.30am on Sundays. To start with we used a mobile phone; we migrated to a system using



simple camcorders; and now we can stream from Melford with rather a swanky system. For those with no internet we also burn DVD's. We've had people tuning in from Thailand, Canada, America ... and even Yorkshire! Alongside this we also kept our children's' work going using our Children at Church Facebook page and doing Zoom Messy Church. Thankfully we can again hold services in church buildings, and we're starting to work through the backlog of weddings and Christenings – couples and parents have had to be very patient. In Alpheton and Shimpling, due to a number of practical constraints, we started by having services on Wednesday, but we are planning to move to Sundays in August (see below). Please keep an eye on the church website and the notice boards just in case things change.

#### **Lawshall**

As well as all this, we have been approached by the Diocese to consider whether we might consider joining with Lawshall parish due to a reorganisation later this year. This is an exciting opportunity due to the connections with the school, but would stretch up somewhat so please pray that we have wisdom.

#### Final thought

None of us will be the same after this year. Let's hope that we can take from the good we have learnt despite the sadness and the challenges ... and make the most of the opportunities that come our way.

#### **Quiet Lanes**

The Parish Council has been involved in a county-wide project on Quiet Lanes. Following consultation with residents, Gents Lane was accepted for designation by the responsible body within the County Council. SCC Highways will erect a small sign at the start of Gents Lane, drawing users' attention to the new designation.



Quiet Lanes do not impose any traffic restrictions but seek to inform road users of the presence of walkers, dog-walkers, cyclists and equestrians and to show more respect for these more vulnerable road users. The aim is to change the mindset that a lane exists only for vehicular traffic: it is there for the benefit of everyone. The cost of the project has been met by the County Council which views the designation of the routes selected, as a desirable asset for the county.

The catalyst for our involvement in this project was the realisation that residents were 'getting out more' in the Covid lockdown world. We saw more people than ever using Gents Lane, close to the most populated part of the village, for informal recreation. We are also aware that Gents Lane links seamlessly with the public footpath system as well as The Street, providing opportunities for residents of all abilities to exercise and appreciate their surroundings. In my role as Chairman of the Parish Council, my overriding concern is to help improve the quality of life of residents. This Quiet Lane initiative is very much in that vein.

## Bonfire guidelines from Babergh District Council

If you must have a bonfire follow these guidelines to avoid causing a nuisance and to keep safe:

- Keep the number of bonfires to an absolute minimum.
- Only burn dry material. This will produce the minimum of smoke.
- Never burn household rubbish, rubber tyres, or anything containing plastic, foam or paint. The Council will collect domestic hazardous waste for a small fee - see our <u>Hazardous</u> <u>Waste Collections</u> page for details.
- Never use old engine oil, methylated spirit or petrol to light or encourage the fire.
- Avoid lighting a fire in unsuitable weather conditions. Smoke hangs in the air on damp, still days and in the evening around sunset – ensure the bonfire is extinguished well before.
- If it is windy, smoke may be blown into neighbours' gardens and across roads.
- Keep the bonfire under adult supervision at all times and ensure it is extinguished completely, by dousing with soil or water, before you leave it.
- Keep a hose pipe or buckets of water close at hand in case the fire gets out of hand.
- Take account of your neighbours' activities e.g. washing hanging on a line, open windows, sitting in garden, decorating etc.
- Consult, or at least warn, your neighbour before lighting a bonfire.

### ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984: SECTION 14(2) TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF PART OF FOOTPATH 7, SHIMPLING

From 31/05/2021 for an initial period of 21 days Footpath 7, Shimpling from The Street to the junction with Gents Lane will be closed to all pedestrian traffic. This is to enable surfacing works. Co-ordinated works may also take place during this period.

The alternative route will be from The Street south west to Gents Lane, south along Gents Lane follow round the corner north westbound and vice versa.

It is intended that the closure will operate until 30/06/2021 and an order will be made to cover the further period.

There is an abundance of roses, small wildlife pond and recently developed kitchen garden incl a wildflower area and fruit cages. Chickens, bees and a boisterous Labrador also live here.
