Report from our Chair, Liz Brunwin, at the meeting held on the 8th November:

The Chair reported that it had been a quiet couple of months. She had attended a budget meeting with Cllrs Shrimpton, Haselhurst and the Clerk – Natasha. This was a

valuable meeting where we go through budget lines both past and present in detail. The Parish Council would consider and agree the budget later in the meeting. The Chair thanked Natasha for all her hard work on this. She reported that the WhatsApp Shimpling Support Group had come in very useful recently when we were asked to pass on an urgent message to someone in the village. It would be good if we could get more residents to join and to this end, she had asked Sarah Smith to put something in the village magazine about this.

The sign for the footpath between The Street and Gents Lane has now been put up and the Chair thanked Ben Hutchinson for doing this work for the village.

The Chair reminded members that at the last AGM she had announced that she would be standing down at the next AGM in 2022. So far no-one has expressed an interest to take on the role, and she urged councillors to consider stepping up in the next month or so. If there were no volunteers, then a representative from Babergh District Council would step in to manage the meetings although the Parish Council would need to put in place arrangements for our Clerk so that she could continue to manage the jobs of the Parish Council in the interim.

Recycling

Please remember that the Parish Council receives money from the paper (although not cardboard) glass, clothing and shoes deposited in the recycling bins near the Bush Inn. Clothing and shoes should be bagged before depositing in the clothing/shoe bank. This income helps to run the council

and therefore is a direct benefit to the village. Please keep recycling.

What the Parish Council have been up to ...

Over the last couple of months, we have:

Set the budget for the Parish Council for 2022/23 and agreed using some of the money from underspend this financial year and contribute £500 from the Covid fund in order to keep our precept increase as low as possible on last year, meaning residents will not have such a big increase in their Council Tax to fund the Parish Council.

Gents Lane has been approved as a Quiet Lane and we are awaiting the sign to go up to spread awareness of this new status.

Approved funding to improve the surface of the layby by the recycling area.

We have organised for guttering on the overhanging buildings for Footpath 7 to protect the new path.

We have purchased a new sign for Footpath 7, Nigel's Way, as it is fondly referred to. Our thanks to Ben Hutchinson for putting this up for us.

The PC have agreed to pay £3,188 from the Covid Fund to have WIFI installed into the Village Hall. We hope you will all agree that this will be a good addition to the Village and could mean new revenue for the Village Hall.

We have agreed to continue the contract with Chris Cooke at Lark Valley for the grass cutting etc, and I hope you will all agree he does a brilliant job with all the grass cutting and hedge cutting in the Village.

We need 2 new Parish Councillors to join our team. Parish Councillors do a worthwhile job ensuring that your voice is heard and overseeing work so that your village is kept looking good. NIGEL WEST

Nigel lived at 4 Gents Lane for over 25 years and ran a small business from his premises at the end of the lane. His company, Sensory Developments, specialised in creating safe and stimulating environments for vulnerable adults and children.

Nigel was passionate about his work and it gave him a strong sense of purpose. He could see that his company was fulfilling a real social need for some of the most disabled members of our society. He took pride in ensuring that the products he designed, made and installed were of the highest quality and that they met the requirements of his clients.



Nigel started off his working life as soon as he could leave school. He trained as a carpenter but also developed a range of manufacturing skills before leaving to set up his own business in Shimpling around 1994. He built up a team of workers with complimentary skills, Angela (office/accounts), Paul (manufacturing/installation) and Ashley (servicing). Nigel himself was able to move between all of these specialisms, as needs demanded, but his forte was sales. His warm personality, understanding of special needs and enthusiasm for his products meant he was very good at his job. He engaged easily with occupational therapists, care home managers and parents, standing out from the crowd by providing bespoke solutions which some of his larger competitors could not match.

Paul said that 'Nigel's work was his hobby and his hobby was his work'. Certainly, he loved what he did and he was never happier than when he was at the workshop with his colleagues. He told me that he felt he had the best job in the world; he was making things which improved his clients' quality of life, he had a great team and he was living and working in a beautiful environment. He was a very social animal and enjoyed talking to all and sundry. Bernard and his dog

might drop by on the way past or Ted Pine or Nicky Ross...he loved talking!

Nigel was 'a giver'. He was always ready to help, whether it was family, friends or neighbours. He was unimpressed by the cult of celebrity or status, rather taking people as he found them. His calm demeanour and good interpersonal skills were great attributes both from a personal and business point of view.

Nigel was probably one of the least materialistic people I know. He had simple tastes; although he was a non-smoker and teetotaller he wasn't in any sense judgemental about those who weren't. We would often joke about him being one of the 'greenest' people aroundhe spent very little on himself, used local services and suppliers as much as possible and walked to work!

He enjoyed his life, focused on Gents Lane and the workshop. He envisaged working on into his 70s if possible as he found it both enjoyable and fulfilling. It came as a great shock when he collapsed and died when out at a local suppliers on 2nd January 2020. There were no warning signs and I had only spoken to him on New Years Day when he was buzzing with new ideas for the business and looking forward to further opportunities.

So how will he be remembered? First and foremost as a kind, warm and generous human being and devoted father. He certainly did reflect all that is best in humanity. Secondly as someone who found meaning in his work, those around him and his environment. Thirdly, he showed how important it is to be calm and avoid creating anger and upset when it achieves nothing.

Nigel was 53 when he died. My abiding memory is of him in the workshop on a weekend with Meatloaf blaring out through the speakers on a continuous loop. When he was there on his own this was his preferred musical choice, one, thankfully, he did not impose on his co-workers during the week!

A week after his death I visited the premises where he had been collecting materials on his final journey. Driving back I switched on the car radio and randomly punched in a station and it threw up one I don't usually listen to. Out came 'Bat out of Hell' by Meatloafone of Nigel's favourite songs, rarely played on radio these daysit does make you wonder, doesn't it?




The 'thermometer' will be making an appearance!


Shimpling & Alpheton W.I.

Members have been really glad to meet up again after such a long time. In September our speaker was Janet Brown on the subject of Patchwork and embroidery. She showed



examples of her work and even embroiders over water colour paintings. We also had an informal meeting in Ali Hughes' garden on a lovely summer's day when members brought along the craftwork they are working on.

In October at Shimpling our speaker was David Merton who gave us an informative talk about the night sky, accompanied by excellent slides. He told us that there are more stars in the universe than there are grains of sand on earth! And there is no need tor a telescope to see the planets.



In November Fay Jones told us about natural dyeing using plants to be found in the hedgerows. Leaves, flowers, roots, bark and galls can all be used as well as some insects. The colours that can be achieved depend on the mordant or fixing agent used. Natural materials such as linen, cotton and wool dye best. We were then able to see examples of her work.

A Christmas meal has been booked for 2nd December and the December meeting will be on 14th December 7.30pm at Shimpling. This will be a Social Evening - members to bring a small plate of food.

HARTEST AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

On November 1st, our meeting began with our AGM. The highlight of the last year had been the very successful Plant



Sale, but attendance at meetings since we restarted in August had been low, despite some excellent speakers. The Programme for 2022 was revealed – it is now available on our website as below. There will be a good mixture of general talks and ones about specific plants, and a couple of interesting visits are booked for June and July. The current committee were returned unopposed, but we are in need of a new Treasurer, if anybody is interested, please contact me.



The AGM was followed by a talk about the East Anglian Air Ambulance, which gave us all an insight into this extremely valuable service.

The next meeting will be on January 10th, because of the New Year's Day Bank Holiday, and will be one of the plant specific talks, about "Irises and Iris Breeding", by Lucy Skellorn. Lucy will be talking about her holding of the National Collection of irises bred by her great, great grandfather, Sir Michael Foster, "the father of Iris breeding", and the history and development of the breeding programme. With such a close family connection, this will provide a real insiders explanation of the development of beautiful and popular irises.

The February meeting, on Monday 7th, has a more general subject, "Asian Woodland Plants for UK Gardens". The speaker is Helen Chen, who made a mid-life career change

from education to horticulture and trained on the WRAGS scheme. (Work and Retrain as a Gardener Scheme) She has worked in estate gardening and retail horticulture, and now has a small nursery, 'Japonica Plants', specialising in bamboo and other interesting plants from east Asia. She holds the National Collection of Disporum, Disporopsis and Prosartes. This should be a fascinating talk on a subject that we have rarely covered before. There will be plants available to buy.

We start at 7.30pm, in the Institute Hall at Hartest. Entry is £2 for members, and £3 for visitors, who are always welcome to come along to our meetings.


