Report from our previous Chair, Gerry Shrimpton, at the meeting held on the 12th September:

The Chair reported;

Over the last couple of months, we have seen the installation of our much-awaited bench at the end of Nigel's Way. Many thanks to Dave Barnbrook for his efforts in securely siting. We have also seen at last the installation of Wi-Fi in the village hall. However, on the downside we continue to be unsuccessful in obtaining agreement on the siting of the 'Quiet Lane' sign in Gents Lane despite repeated and unanswered correspondence with Keith Sampson Traffic Regulation Officer. Also, on the downside we regrettably accepted the resignation of Mike Atkins after about 4 years of valuable and conscientious service. His contribution will be greatly missed. but we look forward to his return when time and commitments allow. So, thanks Mike and we look forward to seeing you back in the not-toodistant future. Overshadowing everything is the sad passing of our Queen of the last 70 years I am sure the villagers of Shimpling will join the council in expressing our condolences to the Royal family for their loss and our gratitude for all she has contributed to our lives for the past seven decades.

Over the last couple of months, we have:

Chased the signage for the Quiet Lanes status for Gents Lane.

The bench has been placed on the Village Green – our thanks to Dave Barnbrook for this.

Had some loose post round the playground fence sorted and straightened out.

Agreed tree planting for the Queens Platinum Jubilee which should be planted soon.

Agreed to resurface the Footpath from the end of Nigels way and turn left, up to the chicane and are awaiting these works to be completed.

There has been talks about renovations or extensions on the Village Hall and Villagers are welcome to come and have their say on this at our next meeting on 21st November.

There have also been discussions about more play equipment within the playground.

The PC purchased AV equipment for the Village Hall – hopefully this will get lots of use and bring in more revenue for the Hall.

Kala brought along Andrea, an adult who explained how riding had helped her to recover from a life threatening illness and given a meaning to her life again.

RDA relies heavily on volunteers, who are needed to give support to all the disabled riders at an annual cost of almost £10,000. All donations are always appreciated.




