**ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN TO REDUCE THE RISKS**

- Subsidence and cracking is reported and any significant holes protected
- All play equipment meets British or European Standards as appropriate
- All play equipment is checked routinely by a competent person and damage reported
- All load bearing play equipment (climbing frames etc.) is checked, inspected annually and serviced as required by a competent person/contractor
- Where possible ball games are restricted to the grass area only
- Quiet areas are provided with facilities to sit and socialise

**ACTIONS SPECIFIC TO ANY COMMUNICABLE DISEASES OR VIRUSES:**

- Posters displayed on playground
- Social distancing must be adhered to at all times
- Please sanitise your hands and your child's hands before entering and on leaving the playground
- Please do not eat or drink in the playground
- Please take any litter (especially face masks and wet wipes) home with you. If you cannot, please use the bins provided
- Only one adult to be in the playground per family
- Maximum of 3 families in the playground at any one time

- Please be considerate and take turns at busy times
